46TH ANNUAL PEDDLER'S FAIR

Did you realize that the Benicia Peddler's Fair is older than the Super Bowl? That's just one of the silly pieces of trivia the Peddler's Fair Committee came up with. We could actually set up a pretty good trivia bee on the Fair. Example, how many booths were in the first Fair, organized by Father Davies, in 1964?

The money made from putting on the Fair is used for the upkeep of the church buildings. Which year was the St. Paul window restored with funds from the Fair?

Many members of the congregation have been Peddler's Fair chairs. Can you name 10? (You can start with Grace Kurtz).

Each year a committee of three begins organizing the Fair in January. This year the committee members are Mike Baldwin, Katie Scott, and Jeff Jarvis. We meet in our attic office in the Old Rectory each week and sift through application from vendors eager to be in our Fair. Although the Fair is an an-

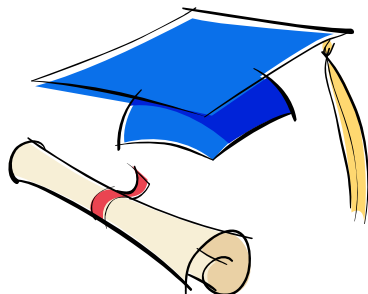
tiques and collectibles fair, we get applications from all sorts of people. Some want to sell hot dogs, some want to sell toe rings, others want to read your palm or pierce your ear.
