

## A Message From the Rector:

### Lent - From the Mountain Top to Golgotha

As a young wife and mother in West Germany, it was a real treat to experience Fasching, Germany's version of Carnival. The festivities were loaded with humor. Jokes and pranks abounded, a lot of fun was poked at officials, the causes of the day and the best beer in the world was consumed in biblical proportions. Things were known to become bawdy, Rose Montag being an X-rated Sadie Hawkins revel. Events reached a fevered pitch with a Wednesday morning Umzüge (parade) to the Rathaus (City Hall) where a great bonfire waited to burn a clowned figure in effigy. At some point, standing around the great fire, one sensed a change in tone. Voices died down, tired and possibly hung over clumps of people settled down, centered themselves by gazing into the fire. Then the voice of the Mayor thundered out: "Fasching ist zuendet! Gehen-Sie weg!" "Go away! The party is over! Lent has begun!" The reveling spent itself, as folks turned and filtered into the churches to sit, reflect and pray, receive the ashes on their forehead, and be sent forth by the priest to observe a holy Lent.

For those people who had experienced what they had, this pattern of living was crucial. That small chunk of the Rhine bank had changed hands between countries in three horrific wars, all in the space of a century. And the countryside was still wracked with bomb craters and exploded bunkers. They knew how to live and they lived fully, celebrated with total bodies and minds and hearts. Then, for them, it was desirable to settle themselves completely to reflection, re-evaluation of life and most definitely for repentance.

It is much more difficult for us. It seems that all of life bleeds continually into each other. Thanksgiving

swallows Advent, which morphs rather than explodes into Christmas, the day after which the red hearts of Valentines' appear. Private and public life melds into internet, Facebook and Twitter. The automobile, once a communications-free sanctuary has become a hands-free telephone booth. Play is work, and work is often viewed as a type of game-play. How are we to turn from life's cacophony to a season of silence and reflection?

It is a challenge, to be sure. Yet here we are. For myself, I believe that this season I shall give myself over to celebration and playful joy. This is Valentine's Day! I shall dine with friends and raise a glass or two in fun and fellowship. I am not sure what Monday will bring, but I shall try for excess in some way or other. On Tuesday, I will eat an extra pancake at Shrove Tuesday supper (Weight Watcher's beware!) and I will give extravagantly to the cooks and servers. This event is, after all an opportunity to support the Sierra Service Project. Then on Wednesday I shall be in the sanctuary with my community. There I will give my whole self over to God's care and ask God to help me live a Lent of discipline and reflection. I will ask God's presence to accompany me as I journey (that is, literally walking my way) through Lent. And I will be ready to observe a Lent of fasting, repentance and reflection.

And You? Will you join in the celebration of Fasching or Carnival or Mardi Gras? Then, will you join with the community of St. Paul's as they come to the altar to receive ashes, that symbol of our mortality, and turn themselves out into the world to observe a holy Lent? May God's blessing be upon all of you this season and always. —Jeanne+

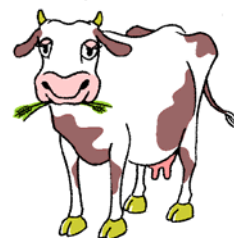
## Parish Directory

# The Holy Land Forum March 7



In January, I spent two weeks in Jerusalem attending a course called "The Palestine of Jesus". The course was offered through St. George's College, which is the former seminary of the Anglican diocese of Jerusalem. Now, though, there are so few seminarians from that diocese that the college has been turned into a continuing education center for those who wish to travel there and study. I was with 15 other people. Eight were students at the seminary in Virginia. We had a Canadian and a Methodist pastor and a Jewish scientist on the course.

The bulk of our stay was spent in and around Jerusalem, tracing the sites of the life of Jesus and those closest to him. We traveled to Ein Kerem, the home of John the Baptist, and to Bethlehem, each of which are short drives from Jerusalem. The college is located less than a 10-minute walk from the Damascus Gate, so many of us spent as much time as we could exploring around the Old City, with its fascinating maze of streets and shops, churches and mosques. The Jewish, Christian, and Muslim histories of the City all pile onto each other in a wonderful and disorienting way.

We did leave Jerusalem for a few nights in Galilee, which is a very peaceful and green place, like a smaller Lake Tahoe. We saw Capernaum and the mountain remembered as the site of the Sermon of the Beatitudes. We visited the Church of the Nativity in Nazareth and the top of Mount Tabor, where Jesus was transfigured before his friends.

Towards the last days of the trip, we walked the Way of the Cross through the rain-soaked streets of Jerusalem at dawn, and visited the most holy spot in Christianity: the Church of the Resurrection where, since at least the fourth century, Christians have prayed at the sites of the crucifixion and the tomb.

Like all Christians, it is the story of Jesus that draws us away from sin and towards God our loving creator. That story, his Gospel, is told in many ways, but it comes alive for us more fully when we see and imagine the places where the events of Christ's incarnation and life and death and resurrection took place. I invite you to learn what you can about the Holy Land, to travel there if you are able to, and to join me on the evening of March 7th for Evening Prayer and a presentation about the Holy Land and its sites.
