# 9/11 Message from the Presiding Bishop

---

On Sunday, September 11, Presiding Bishop Jefferts Schori will be in New York City, preaching at [St. Paul's Chapel](#) in New York City at 7:30 am Eastern. At 11 am Eastern, she will preach at the [Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine](#) in New York City.

*The following is the Presiding Bishop's statement on the September 11 anniversary:*

As we mark the tenth anniversary of the events of September 11, The Episcopal Church continues to work for healing and reconciliation.

Americans experienced the first large non-domestic terrorist attack on our own soil that day, a reality that is far too much a present and continuing reality in other parts of the world. We joined that reality in 2001. Many people died senselessly that day, and many still grieve their loss. All Americans live with the aftermath – less trust of strangers, security procedures for travelers that are intrusive and often offensive, and a sense that the world is a far more dangerous place than it was before that day. Our own nation has gone to war in two distant places as a result of those events. The dying continues, and the world does not seem to have become a significantly safer place.

Yet we believe there is hope. People of faith gave sacrificially in the immediate aftermath of the plane crashes, trying to rescue those in the Twin Towers and the Pentagon, trying to subdue the aggressors on the plane over Pennsylvania, and reaching out to neighbors and strangers alike on that apocalyptic day. Clergy and laity responded to the crisis in New York, Washington, DC, and Pennsylvania, and prayer services erupted in churches and communities across the nation. St. Paul's Chapel, near the site of the Towers, opened its doors to the emergency responders, and volunteers appeared with food and socks, massaging hands and praying hearts. Volunteers continued to staff the Chapel for months afterward, and prayers were offered as human remains were sought and retrieved in the ruins of the Towers.

Church communities in many places began to reach out to their neighbors of other faiths, offering reassurance in the face of mindless violence. That desire for greater

understanding of other traditions has continued, and there are growing numbers of congregations engaged in interfaith dialogue, discovering that all the great religions of the world are fundamentally focused on peace. The violence unleashed on September 11th and in its aftermath was the work of zealots, disconnected from the heart of their religions' foundations.

This tenth anniversary is above all an opportunity for reflection. Have we become more effective reconcilers as a result? Are we more committed to peace-making? The greatest memorial to those who died ten years ago will be a world more inclined toward peace. What are you doing to build a living memorial like that?

# SEPTEMBER 11 MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP

---

*Dear People of God:*

Grace and peace to you.

As our nation, and our various communities prepare for a variety of public observances of the tenth anniversary of 9/11, we Christians need to be preparing ourselves personally as well.

Part of our preparation is in asking ourselves what Archbishop Rowan Williams asked himself and us soon after 9/11: "What are we prepared to learn from this?" (You will recall that he was at Trinity, Wall Street on that day. His book, *Writing in the Dust*, is a very fine theological reflection on that event.)

Part is the work of being more knowledgeable about Islam and more effective in fighting prejudice against Muslims wherever we encounter it. Some of our most important allies in building a peaceful world are the multitude of faithful Muslims who deplore the actions of those hateful extremists who wrap their violence in religion-any religion.

We must work with such allies to oppose the intolerance of fundamentalism and ideological rigidity wherever possible.

Part is remembering. There is the work of prayerfully recalling the powerful images and emotions of that day, and the days and weeks that followed. A few months after 9/11, we brought some of the staff from St. Paul's Chapel to this diocese for a clergy retreat. Two of them had been with Rowan Williams on September 11, 2001; they shared how they had fully expected to die together with him that day.

Another was the vicar, the man to turn the key to St. Paul's and open the door and experience the "miracle of 9/12" - which was not only the astounding fact that that historic building immediately adjacent to Ground Zero was undamaged (except for a single broken chandelier), but all the ways in which it became both a place of refuge and a base for mission to the community of workers and mourners there for many months thereafter.

Eucharistic Christians know that there is more to re-

membering than a function of memory. Memory works to form us; that is why it is important to frame powerful recollections with prayer. When we "do this in remembrance," we are doing anamnesis, entering into the deeper spiritual reality of historical events. We engage in that reality in a way that changes how we are in the present, and reorients us towards the future. Anamnesis is literally to "stop forgetting," to begin again to see things as they truly are, and to be who we truly are.

Thus, when Christians see the frequent 9/11 commemoration admonition to "never forget," it is a reminder to us that Jesus Christ is Lord of all, and that it is our job to bring His Gospel into this and every occasion, and to renew our commitment to live as His disciples.

Our Presiding Bishop has invited us to make this anniversary an occasion for reflection, and for becoming more effective reconcilers and peace-makers. I pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us all in doing just such work-which is really the work of becoming who we are in Christ. With God's help, may we more faithfully resist evil, respect the dignity of every human being, and strive for justice and peace.
